The Bournemouth Natural Science Society was formed in 1903 and has been in this building since 1920. Alfred Russel Wallace was our first Honorary Member. The Society organises lectures and field trips throughout the year and also has a museum. The museum houses the collections donated by members in the early 20th century and includes: birds, reptile and mammalian specimens; moths, butterflies & other insects; shells, rocks, fossils (including dinosaur footprints) & minerals; plus a collection of Egyptian artefacts (including our own mummy - Tahemaa) and local archaeological finds (especially those made by Heywood Sumner).

- Microscope displays, demonstrations and gossip event 10am until 2pm in one large room. Setup from 9am (please book table).
- Then a talk at 2.30pm by Dr. Anton Page of University of Southampton Biomedical Imaging Unit "Microscopy in the Biomedical Imaging Unit – 2D & 3D imaging"
- The BNSS Natural History Museum with Archaeology, Egyptology & Garden will be open to visitors, members, 'young explorers' and the public from 10am-2pm (we normally expect 50-100 visitors at our open days).
- The BNSS building is 15 minutes walk from Bournemouth train station/ coach station (if you contact me, we can arrange a pickup service).
- Parking is available onsite and in Knyveton Road.
- Lunch can be purchased in the vicinity at Lynton Court pub. or the Coop supermarket.
- Tea & coffee available on site.
